T.E.L.P. FAQ 2020-2021

What is TELP?

 TELP (Transportation Extended Learning Program) is an ELP program set up at various sites (hubs) for certain IB and Collegiate Academy students that do not utilize the magnet ramp system. Its purpose is to provide tutoring and homework assistance for these students until their ride arrives.

• Where are the TELP sites?

 Brandon, Newsome, Strawberry Crest, Robinson, Alonso, Armwood, Plant, Westchase Elem, Bloomingdale, Leto

• How does TELP work?

- Students are dropped off at their assigned TELP site in the morning and transferred to their appropriate magnet schools. In the afternoon, the reverse occurs.
- Students should be under adult supervision at all times when on any campus.
- Students work on homework or projects in a designated room until it is time to board transportation.
- If a student chooses, he/she may remain at the TELP site until 6:00 pm or until his/her ride arrives.

Is TELP available to all students?

- No only magnet students who attend Armwood Collegiate Academy, Strawberry Crest IB, or Robinson IB.
- Facilitators at each site should check with buses upon arrival to ensure that only TELP students are on board.

• When does the TELP program start and end?

- TELP will begin the second day of the 2020-2021 school year (September 1, 2020). It will end May 21, 2021.
 - TELP is NOT held on mid-term or final exam days.

• What are the TELP hours?

TELP hours are from the time teachers are released (this will vary by site depending on teacher release time) to 6:00 pm M-F—excluding mid-term and final exam days.

• Where is TELP to be housed at the site?

 Students should be in a room that has computer/internet and restroom access and is separate from a traditional ELP / HOST room.

What are the standards of student conduct for TELP?

o All district policies are in effect and, therefore, should be enforced.

What COVID-19-related policies should be in effect for TELP students?

Students and teachers should adhere to the same district procedures and policies related to COVID-19 as would be found during the school day. Schools should provide a room large enough to house students with effective and safe social distancing in place at all times. Any parents/guardians who enter the premises to pick up their student should be expected to adhere to the same guidelines established for visitors to school sites as established by the school district.

• What is the electronic device policy for TELP students?

- Students may bring smart phones, tablets, laptops, etc. to assist with work they are doing.
 - The use of these items must be commensurate with district guidelines.

How do students sign up for TELP?

• Parents may fill out a TELP application at their student's Magnet School (Armwood Collegiate Academy, Robinson IB, or Strawberry Crest IB).
