9th Grade: RHS Pre IB Program

Pre IB English 1

This course defines what students should understand and be able to do by the end of 9th grade. At this grade level, students are working with universal themes and archetypes. They are also continuing to build their facility with rhetoric, the craft of using language in writing and speaking, using classic literature, essays, and speeches as mentor texts.
