The yearbook and newspaper classes attend multiple multi-day field trips including summer camp and the annual FL Scholastic Press convention in Orlando. Editors attend the National HS Journalism Convention, recently in Boston (23), Philadelphia (24) & Nashville this upcoming fall!

Both classes use an editor system for student leadership. An editor position looks great on a college resume and is like a sports team captain. The classes also enjoy a free membership to Adobe Creative Cloud which includes Photoshop, Lightroom InDesign and Illustrator. We use these programs to edit and design.
